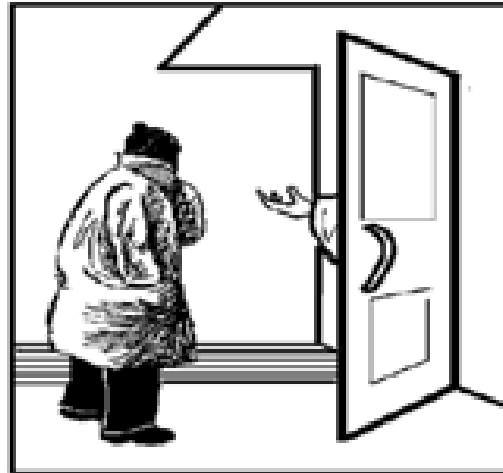


What do we expect?

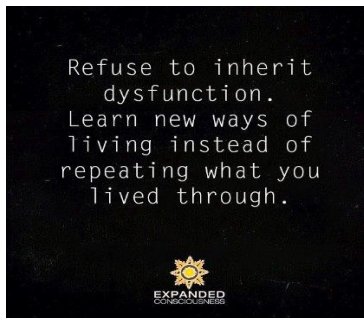

Mission:

Our mission is to help men, eighteen years and older, to face their problems, find wholeness, and successfully integrate back into society.

We are a faith based organization that strives to fulfill a very important need in the ongoing success of our community. We provide housing and support for men who find themselves struggling with physical disabilities, mental health concerns, correctional housing issues, addictions and/or the challenges stemming from reintegration back into society.

What do we do?

We provide services for men who are in need of care who are faced with such challenges as:

- ◆ Mental illness
- ◆ Chemical dependency
- ◆ Traumatic brain injury
- ◆ Learning disabilities
- ◆ Physical disabilities

We provide our residents with a number of services including:

- ◆ Three daily meals
- ◆ Supervised personal care
- ◆ Medication management
- ◆ Support groups
- ◆ Accountability
- ◆ Life skills training
- ◆ Monthly aftercare program of actions

We also provide transportation to care providers and other appointments such as aftercare programs and job & education coaching. We help residents network with social workers, probationary personnel, primary care providers/coordinators, aftercare providers, and other community services. Our staff is trained to provide a loving, safe, and supportive environment for each resident.

Executive Director Pastor Michael Laidlaw:

“The residents are struggling with mental health issues, chemical dependency issues, learning disabilities, and/or physical disabilities. They are homeless or have corrections housing issues, as well as case management requirements and medication needs.

Residents of OIF facilities attend daily support groups, receive individual counseling, and have a structured accountability program that includes following their case management and aftercare programs.”



- ◆ Residents must also sign in and out, perform household chores, follow a personal weekly plan of goals and accountability.
- ◆ Residents are encouraged to participate in other activities essential to reintegration into mainstream society.
- ◆ As residents progress through the program, they gain more freedom as they successfully take on more responsibility in their personal social growth, aftercare, and community activities to reach the goal of caring for themselves and others.



- ◆ We don't play God, jailer, policeman or baby-sitter.
- ◆ We will help you get on your feet again but we won't carry you or drag you.
- ◆ Be ready to do what it takes to succeed in a new life.
- ◆ We are a Non-Denominational Christian Faith Based Ministry. We will be talking about God of the Bible, however, you can choose the support groups that you would like to attend.
- ◆ All potential residents must qualify for Group Residential Housing
